Finding the appropriate housing requires having the right tools.

The internet is a tool that can improve and expand one's housing search. This document provides federal, state, and housing providers, search engines, and other sources. It also provides property managers and landlords with accessible avenues to advertise their properties.

U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)

Locating affordable housing is the most challenging part of the resettlement process. HUD provides housing practitioners with valuable information to demystify what entities receiving HUD funding are available to help find housing and assistance for refugees and newcomers.

Operation Allies Welcome (OAW)

 Operation Allies Welcome is an effort by the Biden Administration to secure housing and employment for 70,000 vulnerable Afghan refugees resettling in the United States. Socialserve

<u>Socialserve</u> is a nonprofit, bilingual <u>call center</u> that connects people to housing and provides support. They provide professional housing locations and assist displaced households in finding new housing. They also offer waiting list support and gather housing data for regions and municipalities across the United States.
